RSZ donates to 'Galagata'

RAILWAY Systems of Zambia (RSZ) have donated K10 million to Vision Stables ahead of this weekend's Commonwealth heavyweight elimination bout between Francis 'Galagata' Zulu and Tanzanian Ashaf Suleman.

Galagata will fight on the undercard of the Africa Boxing Union (ABU) Welterweight title fight between Joseph Kambembe and Kenya's Joseph Miyuno.

Speaking at a press briefing yesterday, RSZ chief executive officer, Benjamin Even said his company came to the aid of Vision Stables because they had had a social responsibility to society.

Even also pledged K2 million that would go to Galagata if he wins this Saturday's fight.

And Vision Boxing Promotion director Henry Mulambo said his Stable has signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Oriental Quarries Boxing Promotions (OQBP).

This will see OQBP stage the fight while Vision Stables will pay the ring officials and cater for the lodging of the opponent.

Mulambo said Vision Stables had a budget of about K60 million to meet all the logistics for the fight.

"We grateful to the Railway Systems for coming to our aid, we have now managed to meet our budget," Mulambo said.
